

Training programme for multipliers "Intersectionality and gender for inclusive Global Citizenship Education" Language: English

The training programme consists of 4 training sessions of approx. 4 hours each, starting in January 2025 and ending in mid-late 2025. It offers lectures, expert talks and dialogue and opens up the possibility for self-reflection and transformative learning. Although the sessions build on each other and it is strongly advised to attend all of them, it is possible to participate only in some of the sessions. The training programme focuses on non-formal educational settings.

Aims of the training programme:

- The participants know what the concepts GCE, intersectionality, gender transformative approach, LGBTIQ+ and inclusion mean for education, focusing on non-formal educational settings.
- Participants know about relevant basic literature and relevant actors in Europe.
- Participants reflect on power relations in the educational context and share their experiences.
- Participants are able to move from theory to practice within GCE.
- Participants learn from each other and from experts from the field.
- Participants are aware of the principles of GCE and are prepared to independently research and develop inclusive and intersectional methods of GCE based on these criteria as part of the "Global Districts" project.
- The participants enjoy the learning process through a good mix of participatory methods, lectures, dialogue formats and self-reflection.
